◆ LOLL DESIGNS CABRIO LOUNGE CHAIR

Loll Designs co-founder Greg Benson made his name designing skate parks, then moved into furniture - which explains why the company's first Adirondack chair was built by repurposing the side panels of ramps. Loll's new Cabrio lounger shows the

▼ VESSEL LUAU LAMP

The 36 high-intensity LED bulbs in each battery-powered Luau softly illuminate any space for up to 10 hours. Lift the 15-inch lantern from its charging stand, and it turns on automatically; rotate it in the stand or with its bottom against the palm of your hand, and the Luau dims.
